**“Art Therapy: Honoring Relationship — An experiential workshop
in art therapy, sandtray, and working across cultures”**

Relationship has been shown to be the single most important factor in the success or failure of the helping professions. This workshop will focus on honoring relationship in art therapy and sandtray and offer a perspective based in metaphor as the language of image. A look at ideas based in relational ethics and culturally competent practice will provide a foundation for our dialogue. We will explore methods of working with imagery and aspects of intercultural interaction through case material presentation and experiential learning in art making and sandtray.



Presenter:

Josie Abbenante, ATR-BC, LPAT, has taught and practiced art therapy for the last 25 years. She added the practice of sandplay to her work ten years ago. Josie directed art therapy in programs at the University of New Mexico and Seton Hill College and has also taught at Eastern Virginia Medical School. She has been a visiting faculty member with Vermont College, Mount Mary College, and Naropa University and currently works with the summer graduate art therapy program at Pratt Institute. She has presented nationally and internationally on topics including archetypal art therapy, transition, art therapy with Deaf culture, art therapy and feminist theory, sandplay and art therapy, work across cultures, and the language of aesthetics and metaphor.

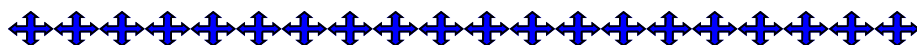

Our own Maxine Hull was selected for a three week artist's residency fellowship at The Hambidge Center in Rabun Gap. The Hambidge Center was founded in 1934 to provide artists opportunity for expansion of creative vision in a pristine setting of 600 acres of woods, streams and meadows. This residency, from Nov. 29th to Dec. 18th allowed Maxine three full weeks solely to pursue art making. Maxine states, "my modality is teeny seed beads (smaller than Indian beads) that are formed into images that come from within. Some become small sculptures that can also be worn as brooches and hung in a frame when not worn. Wearable art. Sometimes they become paintings or an alter. Sometimes a protest image".

We congratulate you, Maxine, on this wonderful opportunity and we hope to see photos of your seed bead art in the next GATAPHILE newsletter.
